



Consensus

- Objectives: Develop BEST PRACTICE GUIDE for selection of most appropriate standards and specs (roadmap to pavement eng projects)
- Target audience: Young inexperienced engrs through to older practitioners
- Scope: Cater for needs at all tiers of gov. UNIFIED GUIDELINE. Pitched at National level with caveats for Provinces etc

Key aspects

- Not just a materials manual but a "sequence of process" for pavement engineering practice
- Not all encompassing contents but "all referencing"
- Logical process: applicable docs, material investigation, testing, designs & documentation
- Balance between prescription and self-interpretation


