

#### **WCG RAMP 2017**



# In presentation of the WCG RAMP 2017 to Cabinet in August 2017 it was recommended that Cabinet:

- Notes the Roads Asset Management Plan 2017/18 to 2026/27, documented as per Draft TRH 22
- Accepts that reductions in MTEF budget allocations will have a negative impact on the overall condition and value of the provincial road network
- Acknowledges that the current limited funds will see a continued gradual decline in the overall condition of the provincial road network
- Notes that DTPW continues to allocate the constrained MTEF budget in a manner so as to optimise the asset as far as possible

#### Based on the analysis done on Managed Network:

- 16 242km of road, carries 19,76 million vehicle-kmper day in 2015 and
- that shows 95% of travel is on paved roads with only
- 607km that has an AADT more than 4501
- A total budget expenditure of approximately R5 800 million p.a. is required over the next 5 years for the network to function at or above intervention levels, that excludes Support, Routine Maintenance, Transfers & Agency Fees, etc currently approximately 1 800 million p.a.




